SUBJECT: Emergency Shelter / Transitional Housing for Homeless Individuals and Families

This report covers the period July 1, 2016 to March 31, 2017 and shows the programmatic capacity and utilization rate, performance measures, and demographic information of all the shelters and transitional housing programs throughout the County.

CAPACITY AND UTILIZATION FOR SINGLE INDIVIDUALS

Currently, there are 11 agencies providing Emergency Shelter and Transitional Housing at 28 different sites, comprising a total of 76 programs at these sites. The total daily bed capacity for the Emergency Shelter sites is 646 beds and they operated at a **91.6%** utilization rate for single individuals during this period. Likewise, the Transitional Housing sites have a total daily capacity of 1,176 beds and had a **84.6%** utilization rate for single individuals. For several sites, this utilization rate combines information from several programs operating at the respective site. The total daily bed capacity for the Cold Weather Shelter program is 360 beds and they operated at a **87%** utilization rate for single individuals/households during this period. For details of the daily bed capacity, actual person shelter days and utilization rate of individuals and heads of households for the Emergency Shelter and Transitional Housing programs, please refer to **Table 1**. (Please note that, due to confidentiality reasons, the information for the shelters for victims of domestic violence are not included in this table.)

CAPACITY AND UTILIZATION FOR HOMELESS FAMILIES

Currently, there are five agencies providing Emergency Shelter and Transitional Housing for homeless families at five different sites, comprising a total of 220 family units at these sites. During this reporting period, the utilization rate for these units was **88.3%**. Please refer to **Table 2** for the details of this utilization. The utilization rate is based on heads of households only.

PERFORMANCE MEASURES

For participants in Emergency Shelter and Transitional Housing programs, the performance measures are comprised of the number of individuals (adults and family members) who exited the programs to known destinations and the number of individuals and heads of households who exited with known incomes greater than \$849. The latter level is set at the equivalent of the average income for a single individual on Supplemental Security Income. Please refer to **Table 5** for this information and note that the goals are from the Continuum of Care adopted *County-wide Performance Measures for 2016-17*.
