- Now Available
 - FAQs for VSPs who are administering the VI-SPDAT

- In Process
 - Updating QAS to ensure safe access for survivors of DV
 - Pre-screening tool for DV, sexual assault, human trafficking

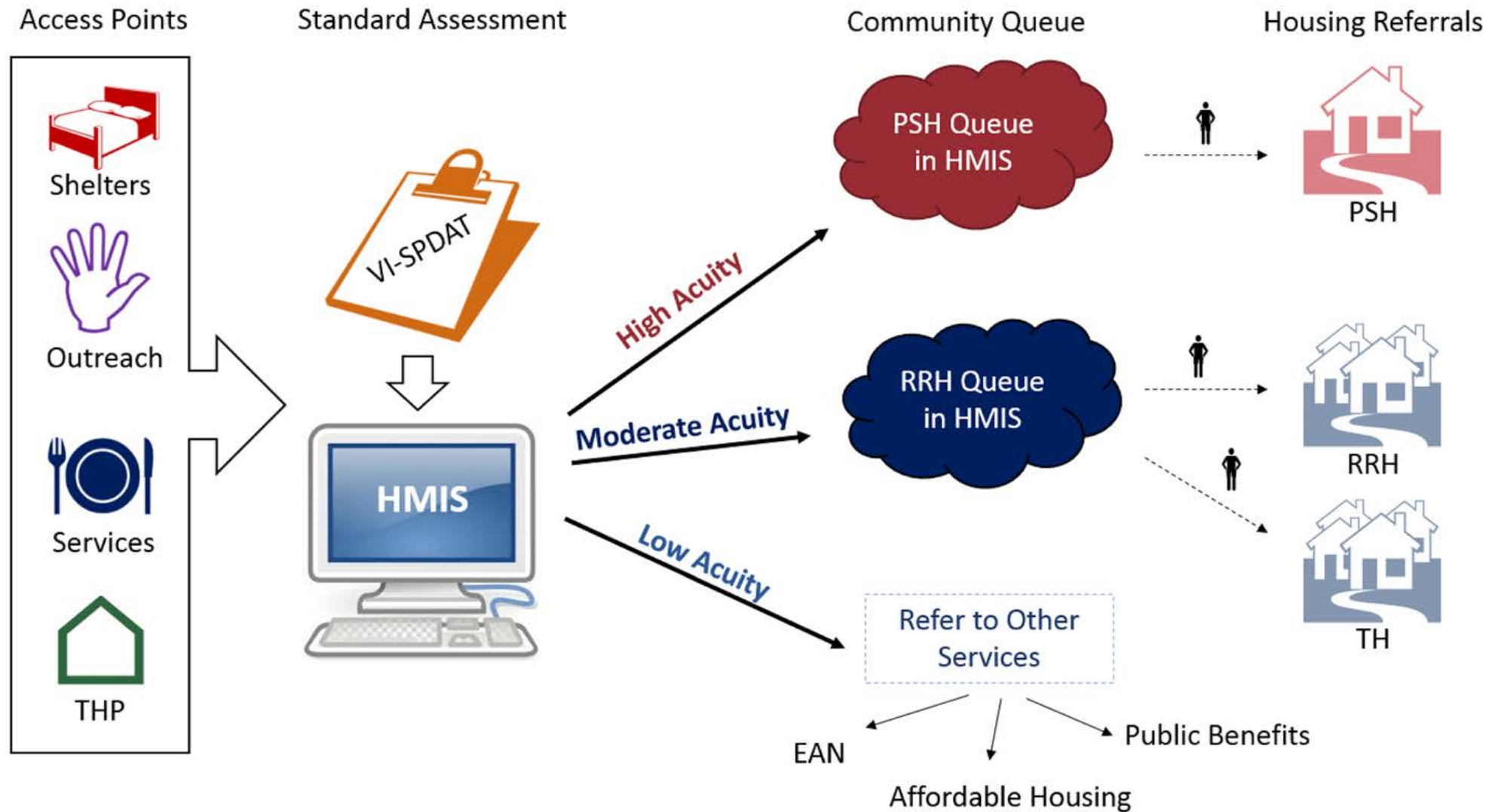

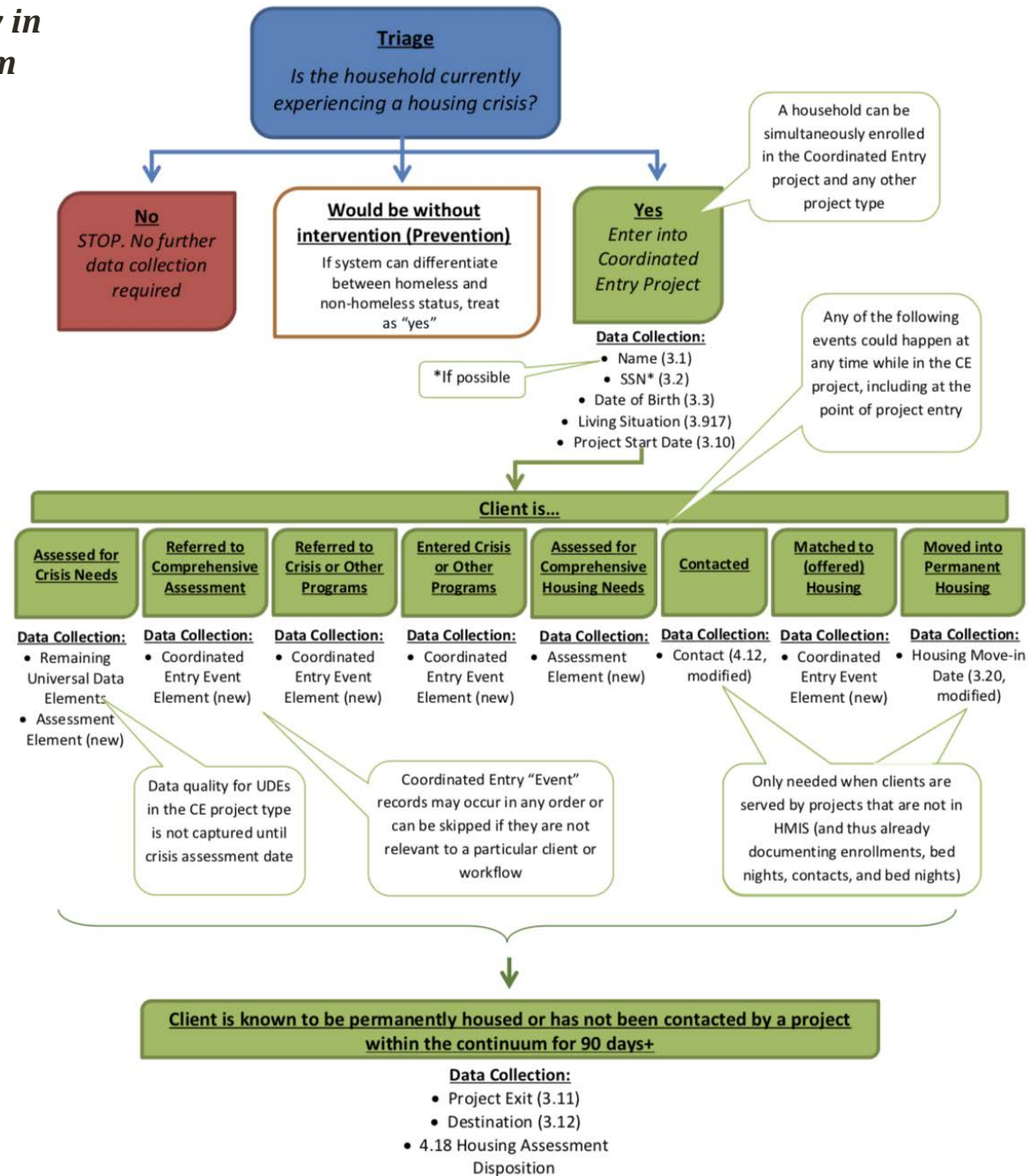
OVERVIEW

- HUD is requesting feedback from CoCs about proposed HMIS data elements for Coordinated Entry
- Proposed data collection is different than how information is currently tracked in HMIS
- Feedback is due to HUD by 10/1

CURRENT COORDINATED ENTRY SYSTEM



Proposed Data Collection Flow in Coordinated Entry Data System

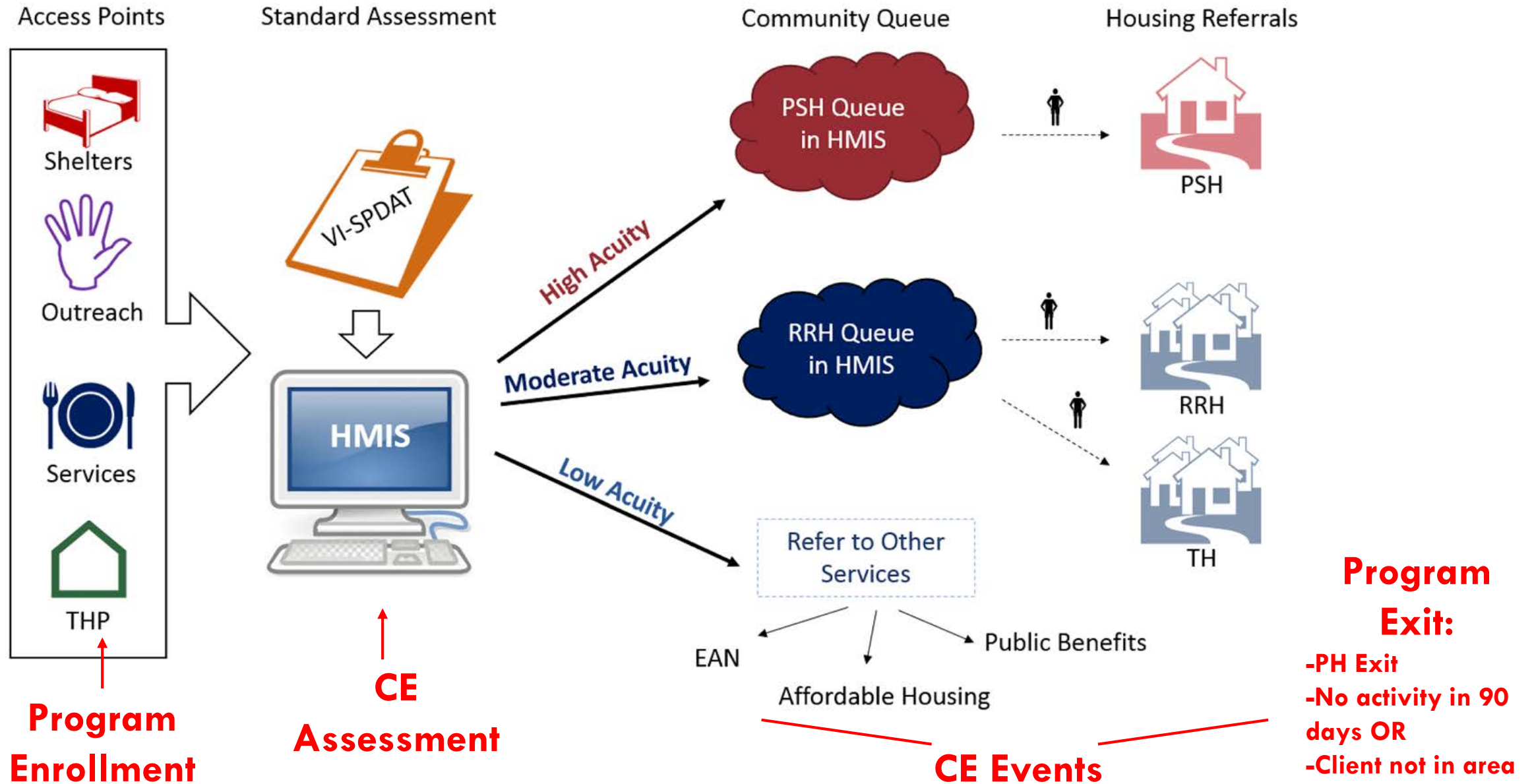




KEY POINTS FROM HUD PROPOSED GUIDANCE

- Homeless clients would be enrolled into a Coordinated Entry project that is shared County-wide (Optional: tracking clients seeking prevention assistance)
- Agencies would enroll clients into the project when they first work with the client
- Coordinated Entry project enrollment would be concurrent with any other project enrollments
- Assessments related to Coordinated Entry would be entered under the project enrollment
- “Events” (e.g. referrals to projects or other assistance) would be tracked under the project enrollment
- If a client is served by non-HMIS participating agencies, Contact / Housing Move-In Date information would need to be entered into HMIS
- If client has no activity in HMIS for 90+ days, they would be exited from the Coordinated Entry project

POTENTIAL CHANGES TO CE SYSTEM





RECOMMENDED REPORTS

HUD recommends specific reports to track clients in the Coordinated Entry project and to monitor the effectiveness of the Coordinated Entry system:

- Client active in the Coordinated Entry project (*Similar to: clients active on the Community Queue*)
- Information about the Coordinated Entry system (*Similar to: how many clients assessed by each agency, how long it took between VI-SPDAT and referral, how many clients were housed after being referred, etc*)

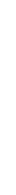
