


Santa Clara County – Coordinated Assessment System Nov 15, 2015 – March 31, 2021:



VI-SPDAT Type



Analysis by Age Tier






The 2020-2025 Community Plan to End Homelessness

The 2020-2025 plan sets aggressive targets designed to reverse the current growth in homelessness and bring us one step closer to our collective goal of eliminating homelessness in our community.
