- C. Level of Need: Low Need| Moderate| High Need
  1. Changing Intervention Type (High| Low Level of Assistance)
  2. Q1 2018-Newly homeless people got a first time VI-SPDAT score (referring to the trend line)
  3. Where does PSH come in-Orange red line
    - a) What other types of housing that would not be called PSH? E.g., Disability required
    - b) Do you have to score in the PSH range in order to be considered eligible-may be if they are not being used we should not be using these?
    - c) Based on score...should say HIGH need
    - d) How does this account for Family VI-SPDAT? Looking at all types of households
      - (1) Make this more clear-
      - (2) Define that this is based on HoH single or multiples if they are families
    - e) Something is wrong with the percentages on boxes (50% RRH-40% PS)
    - f) Intervention Type
      - (1) Permanent Intervention
      - (2) Moderate Intervention
      - (3) Intensive Intervention
      - (4) Time limited instead of severity
      - (5) Use the amount of time spent in the program
    - g) Consistency of language
      - (1) Figure out how to create simple language for public but aligns with what agencies need to know
  4. Project type code

    - b) Folks enrolled in multiple projects would make it difficult to make the lines
    - c) Are these numbers unduplicated?Yes
    - d) Check the transitional housing numbers seems a bit high 1,102 (Household receiving assistance)
