
# Proposed Vision Statement from Santa Clara County YAB:

We envision a community where youth homelessness comes to an end in Santa Clara County by [date].

- YHDP implementation and all responses to youth homelessness are spearheaded by youth and young adult leadership.
- Our community uses a holistic, intersectional, trauma-informed approach to understand the individual and collective needs and experiences of youth.
- We use this lens to provide a support net that meets the diverse needs of youth, including underserved groups such as LGBTQIA+ youth; Black, Indigenous, and other youth of color; youth with experience in the criminal legal system; youth with experience of intimate partner violence and trafficking; refugees and undocumented youth.
- Our community has a support net for youth's basic life skills, healthcare, social connections, housing and economic stability to open up opportunities that lead to mental and physical health, safety, and empowerment.
- The support net we create prioritizes genuine, lasting relationships and avoids transactional and exploitative treatment of youth seeking support.

Ensuring that community connections go throughout Santa Clara County and not just urban hubs.





Goal #2: The community uses prevention and diversion strategies whenever possible, and otherwise provides immediate access to low-barrier crisis housing and services to any youth who needs and wants

Immediate access should include a hotline and ability to speak to a case manager right away to develop immediate steps.

Need a centralized directory of possible services available to youth that they can access.

**Explore partnerships** that will build a safe community and define what collaboration with police would look like and how they can support this effort.

STRENGTHS: What already exists in our community that we can we build on to meet this goal?

NEEDS: What new action steps should we set to address gaps or barriers related to this goal?

Need to understand the reasons homelessness is occurring to develop prevention and diversion strategies? And how young people are able to and prefer to access supports (i.e. phone, in-person)?

Interagency collaboration that fosters linkages and referrals to services early and provides necessary supports with applications, etc.

I think starting an online resource center is a good idea. Going to City Hall is daunting

Engage landlords to identify affordable units for young people who are being diverting but need assistance to find a place.

Need safety net services designed as affirming and safe specifically for LGBTQ+ YYA, especially trans, nonbinary, gender expansive YYA including shelter

Partnership and communication across service agencies - should be able to make strong referrals to other agencies that can meet the young person's needs.

Should have a variety of diverse crisis housing options for young people to choose from based on their preferences (shelter, motels, tiny homes, transitional housing, etc.) that provide different settings and supports.

Make homeless shelters safer and divided with youth-specific spaces. Allowing youth choice in selecting shelters based on their gender and preferences.

> Explore advocacy agenda that will address root problems (lack of affordable housing and living wage jobs) and set clear goals to increase affordable housing availability.

Create a pilot cash assistance program.

**Need services** that specifically address the needs of young people.

Continued communication and wraparound supports to ensure diversion is successful long-term.

Programs that support people where they are so they can stay there (for example, providing rental assistance).

Financial counseling and support to increase income.

Prevention/diversion services should link young people to benefits (SSI, Medical, etc.) and education and employment supports to increase income.

Create easy ways for young people to ACCESS supports

All providers & orgs working with youth can connect them to CE


Youth have guarantee that they won't lose their children, face immigration consequences, have other negative outcomes

For access, use organizations & locations that have youth's trust, connections to communities

Identifying low barrier system & strong case mangement for those who need it

Outreach to promote to/bridge YYA into immediate housing services available; if YYA don't know-not helpful Support for TH/RRH/PH - for YYA; to allow for greater economic building for YYA Identify shared housing/housing pool for housing interventions that identify shared/multiple person housing; (limit to each person having own bathroom/bedroom)

Life/Living Skills to support YA transitioning into 1st apartment

Programs available that go outside of limited income reqs./timeline; identify the link for age 24-26 y/o to support housing

Strengthen TH+ program that has been useful to YA Peer Housing Model to build community & support independency Ensure TH+ program has the capacity to provide greater support (groceries, utility support, household goods, etc.)

PWLE elevated to position of guidance when navigating other YYA into stable living

Folks compensated WELL for being in PEER positions Wrap-around services that aren't limited to housing intervention; i.e. Peer Navigator, on-going support for independent living
